- ▼ A way of setting out our shared understanding of the project, documenting the outcomes that we expect to see and how we will support this vision.
- ▼ A basis on which to measure our impact.

Example Theory of Change for a Recruitment Support Hub

Problem

What is the problem we are trying to solve?

- There are insufficient foster carer placements available for children that need them
- Too many prospective foster carers do not have a good experience during the enquiry and application process and drop out
- There is inconsistency in approach to recruitment between LAs that leads to too much variety in children's experience

Intervention

What do we do to address the problem?

- A recruitment support hub providing a single front door for prospective foster carers and ongoing support through the process
- Standardise processes for preparation, assessment and approval in individual LAs
- Standardise the fees and benefits 'package' for foster carers
- Roll out of Mockingbird
- A regional marketing campaign

- Increase in number of foster carers who are successfully recruited by their Local Authority.
- Reduction in the number of foster carers who de-register.
